The program closes with an epic arrangement of Claude Debussy's *La Mer* arranged by Australian composer Sally Beamish.

This program opens with Igor Stravinsky's *Elegy* for solo viola. This will be followed by the *Madrigals* by Bohuslav Martinů. The capstone of this concert will be the *Divertimento in E-flat Major, K. 563* by Mozart, a serene and happy work, arguably the most inventive composition in the limited string trio literature.

Thirty Thousand Days

We open with the *Phantasy Quartet* by English composer Imogen Holst, the daughter of Gustav Holst. This composition, pastoral in nature, was awarded the Cobbett Prize in 1928. Our program is named after our next offering: *Thirty Thousand Days* for clarinet and string quartet by the young American composer, Chris Rogerson. We then close the concert and the season with the ravishingly beautiful and singular *String Quartet in G minor, Opus 27* by Norwegian composer, Edvard Grieg.

Cantus Novus is an auditioned chamber choir based in Bucks County. Founded in 2000 as an intimate group of choral friends gathering in homes to share a love of music, Cantus Novus has grown to be an established musical presence in the Delaware Valley. Our musical focus can best be described as "roots and wings," with programming spanning several centuries,

honoring our "roots," the rich a cappella choral tradition that springs from the motets of the Renaissance - while our "wings" present audiences with wide-ranging musical offerings from the best of contemporary composers.

Join the singers of Cantus Novus for a season of beauty. A season where love and jubilation are affirmed, where equity and peace take center stage. A time to be affirmed, sustained, and reminded that life truly is a treasure; that beauty does indeed surround us if we only take the time to let it in.
